In 2006 it has become Southern Cross College (NZ) in partnership with Southern Cross College in Sydney. In April 2009, the name was changed to Alphacrucis.

Alphacrucis is a member of the Asia Pacific Theological Association (APTA) and has associations with the World Alliance for Pentecostal Theological Education (WAPTE) Asia Pacific Education Office of the Assemblies of God (APEO) and Springfield-based Global University (ICI).

Semester Dates

There are two semesters each year. Each semester has a study break which generally aligns with the NZ school holidays. Students may begin their programme of studies at the beginning of the first or second semester. Applicants may be enrolled as part-time students in either semester.

Programmes

Certificate in Christian Ministries

This Level 4 programme gives students an introduction to Christian theology, biblical studies and discipleship as they relate to Christian ministry and pastoral practice in a variety of contexts.

The Internship programme provides learners with the opportunity to engage with Christian communities (churches and/or other faith-based agencies) and apply theoretical learning with ministry practice experience under appropriate mentoring and supervision.

This programme of study leads to the New Zealand Certificate in Christian Ministry (Level 4) with a strand in Internship.

Key Features:

- 50% hands-on
- Students may begin in either Semester 1 or 2
- Blended and Distance delivery through the e-learning platform Moodle
- Can be undertaken on a full-time or part-time basis, with a minimum of 15 credits (1 paper) and a maximum of 60 credits (4 papers) per semester
- To gain the qualification, students must successfully complete the six core papers, totalling 120 credits
- Upon completion, students may continue their studies in the Level 5 Diplomas in Christian Leadership, Theological Studies or Chaplaincy, or the Bachelor of Ministry.

Entry Requirements:

- NCEA L1
- Age 17 or over
- Over 20 years old may apply for mature entry
- Selection and mentoring by the learner's faith community may be required
- For international students for whom English is not a first language, IELTS 5.5 (Academic)

Diploma in Christian Leadership

This Level 5 programme allows students to gain a broad range of knowledge and skills in Christian leadership and ministry practice. This will create the opportunity to enter a ministry leadership career, as well as leadership roles in the not-for-profit sector and a wide range of community vocations.

This programme of study leads to the New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies (Level 5) with a strand in Leadership.

Key Features:

- 25% hands-on
- Students may begin in either Semester 1 or 2
- Blended and Distance delivery through the e-learning platform Moodle
- Can be undertaken on a full-time or part-time basis, with a minimum of 15 credits (1 paper) and a maximum of 60 credits (4 papers) per semester
- Selected papers may be offered as intensives
- To gain the qualification, students must successfully complete all the papers in the chosen option, giving 120 credits in total
- Upon completion, students may continue their studies in the Bachelor of Ministry. Credits from some papers may be transferrable.

Entry Requirements:

- Age 17 or over
- Over 20 years old may apply for mature entry
- NCEA L3 or University Entrance
- Selection and mentoring by the learner's faith community may be required
- For international students for whom English is not a first language, IELTS 5.5 (Academic)

Course Structure:

Students have the choice between two different pathways. Option A includes 30 credits of ministry placement (total of 150 hours placement time), whereas Option B includes 60 credits of ministry placement (total of 300 hours placement time). These are outlined below.

Diploma in Chaplaincy

This Level 5 programme allows students to gain a broad range of knowledge and skills in Christian ministry and Chaplaincy practice, creating the opportunity to enter a Chaplaincy career with options in armed service, hospitals, schools and a wide range of community chaplaincy places.

This programme of study leads to the New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies (Level 5) with a strand in Chaplaincy.

Key Features:

- 25% hands-on
- Students may begin in either Semester 1 or 2
- Blended and Distance delivery through the e-learning platform Moodle
- Can be undertaken on a full-time or part-time basis, with a minimum of 15 credits (1 paper) and a maximum of 60 credits (4 papers) per semester
- Selected papers may be offered as intensives
- To gain the qualification, students must successfully complete all the papers in the chosen option, giving 120 credits in total
- Option for membership of Chaplaincy New Zealand for graduates
- Upon completion, students may continue their studies in the Bachelor of Ministry. Credits from some papers may be transferrable.

- Over 20 years old may apply for mature entry
- NCEA L3 or University Entrance
- Selection and mentoring by the learner's faith community may be required
- For international students for whom English is not a first language, IELTS 5.5 (Academic)

Diploma in Theological Studies

A graduate of the Level 5 Diploma in Theological Studies will be able to demonstrate a foundational understanding of the biblical texts, use the tools of exegesis, describe the core theological beliefs of the Christian tradition and apply these to spirituality, church life and mission in a variety of contemporary contexts. They will have developed skills in pastoral ministry and leadership, grounded in a theological framework and locating Christian mission in local, bicultural and cross-cultural contexts.

This programme of study leads to the New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies (Level 5) with a strand in Theological Studies.

Key Features:

- 25% hands-on
- Students may begin in either Semester 1 or 2
- Blended and Distance delivery through the e-learning platform Moodle
- Can be undertaken on a full-time or part-time basis, with a minimum of 15 credits (1 paper) and a maximum of 60 credits (4 papers) per semester
- Selected papers may be offered as intensives
- To gain the qualification, students must successfully complete all the papers in the chosen option, giving 120 credits in total

Upon completion, students may continue their studies in the Bachelor of Ministry. Credits from some papers may be transferrable.

- Age 17 or over
- Over 20 years old may apply for mature entry
- NCEA L3 or University Entrance
- Selection and mentoring by the learner's faith community may be required

Bachelor of Ministry (English and Korean)

This Level 7 undergraduate degree programme aims to provide students with knowledge and skills with which to collect, analyse, organize, summarize and critically evaluate information on a broad range of topics and contemporary issues in Christian Theology and ministry from a wide range of sources.

It is designed to help people in their ministry and leadership, focussing on spiritual and character formation as well as practical aspects of ministry.

Key Features:

- Students may begin in either Semester 1 or 2
- Blended and Distance delivery through the e-learning platform Moodle
- Can be undertaken on a full-time or part-time basis, with a minimum of 15 credits (1 paper) and a maximum of 60 credits (4 papers) per semester
- Selected papers may be offered as intensives
- To gain the qualification, students must successfully complete 24 papers each worth 15 credits, giving 360 credits in total

Entry Requirements:

- Domestic students must have 42 NCEA Level 3 credits, a Level 5 New Zealand qualification or New Zealand
 University Entrance or equivalent
- English level of IELTS 5.5 or higher
- Students over 20 years old may apply for Mature Entry

Staircasing:

Students who have completed either the Diploma in Theological Studies Level 5 or the Diploma in Christian Leadership Level 5, leading to the New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies Level 5, can apply to enter the second year of the Bachelor of Ministry.

College Life

College life is empowered by the vitality of Spirit-filled worship that encourages the full expression of personal devotion to the Lord, warm-hearted Christian fellowship, and service. There is a strong emphasis on academic excellence, along with the practical elements of Christian life and the development of godly character.

Accommodation

English Language Competence

Since our courses are taught in English, except for the BMin Korean, students must have adequate competency in English language. This includes Domestic students for whom English is a second language.

Overseas students must produce an IELTS certificate or equivalent if they are from a non-English speaking country (see course for level required). Western Europeans may be accepted without IELTS if they can verify that they have had at least 5 years of English at school or have previously studied in another English-speaking country. For International students enrolling in NZ, study at another institution (verified) or an interview may be used to verify English competency.

Financial Information

Alphacrucis College New Zealand is a Private Training Establishment (PTE) that receives Government funded subsidies for eligible domestic students. This funding, together with the generous contribution of time from the adjunct faculty and visiting lecturers helps in keeping costs to a minimum. Students are charged fees, which make up the balance of their tuition costs.



Full time domestic students may apply to <u>StudyLink</u> for student loans and allowances provided through the Ministry of Education (further details are available from the College).

Fee details are provided on a separate schedule available from the Registrar, and are protected by the Public Trust according to the NZQA Student Fee Protection Rules 2013 and the Tertiary Education Commission.

Domestic Students

Student fees are payable in full after the eighth day following the commencement of courses in each semester. Where students cannot meet this requirement an alternative schedule of payments may be negotiated. This may be on a weekly or monthly basis, payable in advance.

If you have not participated in any tertiary studies before, then you may be eligible for final-year fees-free study allowances. For more information, please click on the weblink here: https://www.feesfree.govt.nz/

International Students

Students will need to pay their full fees prior to obtaining a student visa. When students make their fee payments, Alphacrucis will deposit the money into a secure trust account. A receipt and notification of acceptance will then be sent to the student so that a visa application can be made.
